

November 4-H Poster Contest



GUIDELINES:

- 1. Your poster must be about 4-H. You can show what you think 4-H is, what you do in 4-H, or what you think 4-H does for young people.
- 2. Posters must be horizontal.
- 3. Posters must be 14" x 22".
- 4. Choose a catchy slogan or idea related to 4-H.
- 5. Mark art work relate to your slogan or idea. You may use drawings, paintings, cutouts, magazine pictures, etc., to decorate your poster.
- 6. You may use water colors, inks, crayons, charcoals, oils, etc., to add color to your poster.
- 7. **Do not use** well-known cartoon figures such as Snoopy, Garfield, Dora, etc., because they are copyrighted.
- 8. No 3-D posters! Poster materials should not extend more than 1/8" from the poster surface.
- 9. Write your name, your teacher's name, and your school's name on the back of the poster.

POSTER POINTERS

- Use large enough letters to be seen from across the room (2"-3").
- Use simple lettering.
- Make all of your letters the same.
- Use a color combination that is easy to read.
- It is recommended that you do not use glitter on the poster.
