



1. There is not a fee collected to be a part of the Lincoln County Poultry Chain.
2. Being a livestock project some loss can be expected (3 to 4 chicks) if you lose more than the expected you must notify the 4-H office as soon as possible so adjustments can be made.
3. Pullets returned by the 4-H club member will be shown and sold at our Poultry Show & Sale. Each 4-H club member may receive some prize money in accordance with the placing his or her pullets received at this show from the official judge(s). On this same day the pullets returned by each 4-H club member will be sold at this Sale, and the proceeds earned will be placed back into the 4-H Poultry Fund to give other boys and girls the same opportunity that you had, to receive baby chicks the next year. If a 4-H club member fails to bring the designated number of pullets to the sale, he or she will be obligated to buy the pullets themselves at the average sale price.
4. Baby chicks will be picked up at the 4-H Office on the day they arrive.
5. The 4-H club member agrees to show two entries (6 birds) if they received 25 baby chicks or one entry (3 birds) if they receive 12 baby chicks in the Lincoln County Show. The Show and Sale is planned for September 29.
6. This year we are getting Black sex-link and Rhode Island Red Birds
